

RESOLUTION 2008-03-1302

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WESTON, APPOINTING THE ELECTION OFFICIALS FOR THE MAY 10, 2008 CITY COUNCIL ELECTION, SETTING THE RATE OF COMPENSATION, THE MAXIMUM NUMBER OF ELECTION CLERKS, AND DESIGNATION OF THE EARLY VOTING BALLOT BOARD.

WHEREAS, on February 12, 2008, the City Council of the City of Weston, ordered an election to be held on Saturday, May 10, 2008 for the purpose of electing the three Council members.

Section 1. The Election Judges to serve at the polling places of such election shall be and are hereby appointed as follows:

Election Judge: Don Wren
Celina , Texas 75009

Alternate Election Judge: Gayle Poer
McKinney, Texas 75071

Election Clerk: Evelyn Adams
McKinney, Texas 75071

Section 2. The judges and clerks shall be compensated at the rate of fifteen and 00 dollars (\$15.00) per hour. No judge or clerk shall be paid for more than one hour of work before the polls open and no period of time subsequent to two hours after voting is concluded by all voters offering themselves for voting during regular voting hours, whichever is later. The judge who delivers the returns of the election shall be paid an additional twenty-five and 00 dollars (\$25.00) provided he/she returns all unused election supplies when he/she makes delivery of the returns of the election.

Section 3. There shall be a maximum of three (3) full-time clerks appointed by the Election Judge. The alternate election judge shall serve as a clerk provided the election judge herein appointed is available to conduct the election.

Section 4. An Early Voting Ballot Board is hereby designated to count the early votes cast by mail and by personal appearance. Don Wren is duly appointed as Presiding Judge of said Board, and shall appoint other members as provided in the Texas Election Code, Section 87.002 (b).
