A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF WESTON, TEXAS, 2004 ULTIMATE RATIFYING AND CONFIRMING THE BOUNDARY AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITIES OF WESTON, MCKINNEY, CELINA AND PROSPER AND THE DECLARATORY JUDGMENT IN CAUSE NO. 199-00878-03 IN THE DISTRICT COURT OF COLLIN COUNTY, TEXAS; DECLARING NULL AND VOID THE DECEMBER 11, 2007 ACTION OF THE WESTON CITY COUNCIL REGARDING A REQUEST FOR A BOUNDARY ADJUSTMENT WITH THE CITY OF MCKINNEY AND A REQUEST FOR THE RELEASE OF CERTAIN PROPERTY FROM THE CITY OF WESTON'S BOUNDARY AND EXTRATERRITORIAL JURISDICTION; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Weston, Texas is a Type A general-law municipality located in Collin County, created in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 6 of the Local Government Code and operating pursuant to the enabling legislation of the State of Texas; and

WHEREAS, in 2001 the cities of Celina, McKinney, Prosper and Weston entered into an Ultimate Boundary Agreement which fixed their ultimate common boundaries and their respective future annexations; and

WHEREAS, on April 20, 2004, the District Court of Collin County, Texas, 199<sup>th</sup> District, in cause No. 199-00878-03, styled *In Re: Collin County, Texas, Celina, Texas, McKinney, Texas, Prosper, Texas, and Weston, Texas,* entered a declaratory judgment which fixed and confirmed the common boundaries of those cities; and

WHEREAS, the declaratory judgment entered by the 199<sup>th</sup> District Court was not appealed and is a valid final judgment; and

WHEREAS, on May 1, 2010, the then-Mayor of the City of Weston sent a letter to the City of McKinney, stating that on December 11, 2007, the Weston City Council had released Mr. Norman Gidney's property (I.D. # 1054012 and 2121281) from the City of Weston's boundary and ETJ and had approved a boundary adjustment between the City of Weston and the City of McKinney: and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds it necessary to clarify the effect of the City Council action on December 11, 2007 and the then-Mayor's letter of May 7, 2010.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WESTON, TEXAS THAT:

# SECTION 1.

The above recitals are true and correct and are made a part of this Resolution to the same extent as if copied in this Section.

#### SECTION 2.

The City Council hereby ratifies and confirms the 2001 Ultimate Boundary Agreement between the cities of Celina, McKinney, Prosper and Weston, and the 2004 Declaratory Judgment of the District Court of Collin County, 199th District, in cause No. 199-00878-03.

## SECTION 3.

The City Council hereby declares the action of the City Council on December 11, 2007 to be null and void because it violates the provisions of the Ultimate Boundary Agreement and is inconsistent with the Declaratory Judgment of the District Court of Collin County, 199th District, and the City Council hereby rescinds the December 11, 2007 City Council action.

## **SECTION 4.**

The City Council hereby denies the request to release the property owned by Norman Gibney from the boundary and extraterritorial jurisdiction of the City of Weston, and hereby denies the request for a boundary adjustment between the City of Weston and the City of McKinney.

# SECTION 5.

The Mayor is directed to send copies of this Resolution to the Mayors of the cities of Celina, McKinney, and Prosper

## SECTION 6.

This resolution shall be effective from and after its passage and adoption by the City Council.

WHEREAS, Section 42.023, Local Government Code, authorizes a municipality to reduce its extraterritorial jurisdiction by a resolution adopted by the governing body of the municipality;

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Weston, Texas, that:

- Section 1. The City Council of the City of Weston, Texas, desires to enter into that certain ultimate boundary line agreement with the City of Celina, Texas, which is attached hereto and intended to be a part hereof for all purposes and intents.
- Section 2. The Mayor of Weston is hereby authorized to execute the boundary agreement and to forever bind the City thereto.
- Section 3. The City Secretary is directed to file one copy of the original document with the Land Records of Collin County, Texas, to put all persons on notice as to the future ultimate expansion plans of the City.

# ULTIMATE BOUNDARY LINE AGREEMENT

STATE OF TEXAS	§ 8	KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS
COUNTY OF COLLIN	8 §	M.O.V. DE MENUEL MEDELLA

This Agreement is made and entered into by and between the City of Weston, Texas ("Weston") and the City of Celina, Texas ("Celina").

WHEREAS, Weston and Celina are governed by the laws of the State of Texas governing municipalities; and

WHEREAS, Weston and Celina are adjacent cities; and

WHEREAS, Section 43.031 of the LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE, Texas Revised Civil Statutes, authorizes adjacent municipalities to make mutually agreeable changes in their boundaries; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 791, Texas Government Code, permits local governments to enter into agreements relating to future provisions of governmental functions and services; and

WHEREAS, Weston and Celina desire to enter into this Agreement designating the future ultimate boundary line between the two cities so that each of them can plan for the provision of future governmental services and functions;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and conditions set forth herein, the parties hereto agree as follows:

- 1. Weston and Celina agree that their future ultimate common boundary lines and their future respective annexations shall meet at the points and along the lines more specifically set out in Exhibit A attached hereto for all purposes and intents.
- 2. Weston hereby discontinues and relinquishes from its corporate limits and extraterritorial jurisdiction any territory which is currently beyond the boundary line described in Exhibit A, if any, and adjusts its corporate limits and extraterritorial jurisdiction accordingly.
- 3. Celina hereby discontinues and relinquishes from its corporate limits and extraterritorial jurisdiction any territory which is currently beyond the boundary line described in Exhibit A, if any, and adjusts its corporate limits and extraterritorial jurisdiction accordingly.
- 4. Weston and Celina agree that their future annexations will not conflict with the terms and intent of this Agreement and that neither will attempt to annex or claim territory or extraterritorial jurisdiction contrary to the terms of this Agreement.
- 5. Weston and Celina agree that this Agreement repeals and replaces any prior ordinances or agreements between the two cities, but only to the extent that such prior ordinances or agreements conflict with this Ultimate Boundary Line

Agreement.

- Weston and Celina acknowlege and consent to any proposed adjustment of the 6. other city's territory and boundaries to comply with this Agreement and agree that neither party, as a result of the mutual execution of this Agreement, now encroaches over the ultimate boundary line. Weston and Celina agree that they will not, in the future, encroach upon the other parties' area beyond the agreed boundary line as adjusted herein without the express written consent of the other.
- This Ultimate Boundary Line Agreement is executed on behalf of the respective 7. cities by their respective Mayors as authorized by Resolutions of the City Councils of the respective cities, which were duly passed.



BEGINNING at the intersection of the west right-of-way line of F.M. Highway 2478 with the extended south right-of-way line of County Road 170;

THENCE in an easterly direction crossing F.M. Highway 2478 and continuing along the south right-of-way line of County Road 170 an approximate distance of 21,400 feet to the intersection of the south right-of-way line of said County Road 170 with the west corporate boundary line for the City of Weston, said point being a distance of 500 feet west of the centerline of F.M. Highway 543;

THENCE in a southerly direction along a line parallel to and 500 feet west of the centerline of F.M. Highway 543 an approximate distance of 9900 feet to the most southwesterly corner of the corporate boundary line for the City of Weston, said point being 500 feet west of the centerline of said F.M. Highway 543 and 500 feet north of the north right-of-way line of County Road 168;

WHEREAS, on August 10, 2010, the City of Weston adopted a Resolution rescinding certain actions taken in 2007 regarding a requested boundary adjustment between the City of Weston and the City of McKinney, a copy of which Resolution is attached hereto, marked "Exhibit A" and made a part hereof; and

WHEREAS, the attached Resolution of the City of Weston also ratifies and confirms such Ultimate Boundary Agreement and declaratory judgment.



A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF WESTON, TEXAS, RATIFYING AND CONFIRMING THE 2004 ULTIMATE BOUNDARY AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITIES OF WESTON, MCKINNEY, CELINA AND PROSPER AND THE DECLARATORY JUDGMENT IN CAUSE NO. 199-00878-03 IN THE DISTRICT COURT OF COLLIN COUNTY, TEXAS; DECLARING NULL AND VOID THE DECEMBER 11, 2007 ACTION OF THE WESTON CITY COUNCIL REGARDING A REQUEST FOR A BOUNDARY ADJUSTMENT WITH THE CITY OF MCKINNEY AND A REQUEST FOR THE RELEASE OF CERTAIN PROPERTY FROM THE CITY OF WESTON'S BOUNDARY AND EXTRATERRITORIAL JURISDICTION; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, on April 20, 2004, the District Court of Collin County, Texas, 199th District, in cause No. 199-00878-03, styled In Re: Collin County, Texas, Celina, Texas, McKinney, Texas, Prosper, Texas, and Weston, Texas, entered a declaratory judgment which fixed and confirmed the common boundaries of those cities; and

WHEREAS, the declaratory judgment entered by the 199th District Court was not appealed and is a valid final judgment; and

WHEREAS, on May 1, 2010, the then-Mayor of the City of Weston sent a letter to the City of McKinney, stating that on December 11, 2007, the Weston City Council had released Mr. Norman Gidney's property (I.D. # 1054012 and 2121281) from the City of Weston's boundary and ETJ and had approved a boundary adjustment between the City of Weston and the City of McKinney: and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds it necessary to clarify the effect of the City Council action on December 11, 2007 and the then-Mayor's letter of May 7, 2010.
